

RESOLUTION NO. 2025-02

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF PECK, NEZ PERCE COUNTY, IDAHO AUTHORIZING THE ADOPTION OF THE NEZ PERCE COUNTY MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL ALL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN (2025 THRU 2030).

WHEREAS, all of Nez Perce County, Idaho has exposure to natural, technological, & man-made hazards that increase the risk to life, property, environment, and County's economy; and

WHEREAS; proactive mitigation of known hazards before a disaster (event) can reduce or eliminate long-term risk to life and property; and

WHEREAS; The Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (Public Law 106-390) establishes requirements for pre and post disaster hazard mitigation programs; and

WHEREAS; the local municipalities with the planning objectives have come together to pool resources and create consistent mitigation strategies within Nez Perce County; and

WHEREAS; the Nez Perce County Office of Emergency Management has completed a planning process that engages the public, assesses the risk, and vulnerability to the impacts of natural, technological and man-made hazards, develops a mitigation strategy consistent with a set of uniform goals and objectives, and creates a plan for implementing, evaluating, and revising this strategy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PECK, NEZ PERCE COUNTY, IDAHO:

- 1) Adopts in its entirety, the Nez Perce County Multi-Jurisdictional All-Hazard Mitigation Plan (the "Plan") as the jurisdiction's Hazard Mitigation Plan and resolves to execute the actions identified in the Plan that pertains to this jurisdiction.
- 2) Will use the adopted and approved portion of the Plan to guide pre and post disaster mitigation of the hazards identified.
- 3) Will coordinate the strategies identified in the Plan with other planning programs and mechanisms under its jurisdictional authority.
- 4) Will continue its support of the annual revisions as described within the Plan.
- 5) Will help to promote and support the mitigation successes of all participants in this Plan.
- 6) Will incorporate mitigation planning as an integral component of government and partner operations.

7) Will provide an update of the Plan in conjunction with the County no less than every five years.

This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
