

Call to Order: Mayor Carson called meeting to order at 10:00 am on Monday, April 20, 2026.

Employee Attendance: Anthony Gravenmier (Back-up Water Operator), Leroy Kuykendall (Maintenance), Megan Weikle (Clerk/Treasurer)

Pledge of Allegiance: lead by Council President Milt Nodacker

Roll Call and Conflict of Interest: Council President Milt Nodacker, Councilmembers Tammy Hassell, Bennie Gockley, and Mayor Cheryl Carson were all present with no conflicts of interest. Councilmember Rob Milchak was absent.

1. **Read Ordinance No. 190 by Title Only:** Megan Weikle read Ordinance No. 190 by title only for the second time.
2. **Discuss Revisions to Ordinance No. 49:** Council President Nodacker shared that he had retyped the ordinance in question for easier reading. Mayor Carson suggested that once the revisions are passed and approved, the ordinance be recorded with Nez Perce County. Milt suggested that a copy of his retyped version and a copy of the originally recorded ordinance be available for the Town Hall Meeting that evening. Milt went on to remark that he could tell that Ordinance No. 49 was adopted at the request of the State of Idaho; that cities at that time were required to adopt the State Code as their own, specific to Motor Vehicle Laws, or come up with their own code to address vehicle laws. He also shared that the City of Peck Ordinance No. 49 clearly states that Idaho State Code Title 49 has been adopted by the City of Peck in its entirety, with room to customize to the needs of the city. Council Member Tammy Hassell raised the question of Nez Perce County Code that might apply to Main Street/Big Canyon Road.
3. **Discuss Town Hall Meeting Regarding Ordinance No. 49:** Mayor Carson repeated that copies of Ordinance No. 49 would be provided for attendees at the Town Hall Meeting. Milt expressed a desire for an orderly discussion and a polite open forum, and Mayor Carson agreed. She stated that she would tell attendees that their comments would be recorded and that the Council would address concerns that attendees brought forth.
4. **Discuss Refuse Accumulation Nuisance Declaration:** Mayor Carson opened the discussion by presenting the Council with a debris removal quote for \$20,750 for a specific property in the City Limits that is in violation of Ordinance No. 52. Megan shared the research that she conducted which outlined how the City Council could accurately and legally declare the situation at the property in question a nuisance and then to take action to abate the nuisance. She shared that the process includes inspection of the area by a City employee or City Council Member, documentation of the site with photos, a Council vote to declare the refuse accumulation a nuisance based upon findings, sending appropriate notice, and having plans to abate and recover costs. Conversation turned to whether the City Council had implied or express authority to place liens. Mayor Carson suggested that the City Attorney be consulted regarding the matter. Questions were raised about other properties who are also in violation of Ordinance No. 52, and Mayor Carson suggested that documentation be gathered to have ready. Megan asked about the possibility of a Town Hall Meeting to address Ordinance No. 52 and Mayor Carson stated that it may be necessary in the future. Tammy Hassell suggested that a reminder go on the City website about the City Clean Up Day on April 25.
5. **IRWA Spring Conference 2026 Report by Anthony Gravenmier:** Anthony shared that he found the conference beneficial for the contacts he was able to make. He also stated that DEQ is scheduled to release funding charts soon. Anthony shared that DEQ gave the City of Peck the green light to handle the settling pond in whatever way the City sees fit and that the same goes for spraying for weeds near the plant.






